





Wanna stay warm and toasty on a dive? Then stay out of the water. What? Stay out of the water? Yes! Unlike a wetsuit, a dry suit seals you off from the outside water. In the PADI Dry Suit Diver Specialty course, you'll learn how to use a dry suit. And that helps keep you warm! Even in very cold water.

- Must be a PADI Open Water Diver or Junior Open Water Diver (or hold a qualifying certification from another training organization) and at least 12 years old
- · Don and doff techniques specific to your dry suit
- · Dry suit buoyancy control skills
- Dry suit maintenance and storage
- Undergarment options (fleece or overall-type garments worn under the dry suit)
- The PADI Dry Suit Diver certification credits toward the PADI Master Scuba Diver rating

Prerequisites: Open Water or Junior Open Water Certification (must be over 12)

Cost: Course fee is \$250 (including drysuit review and fitting session, pool orientation dive and 2 open water dives) plus the PADI e-Learning course fee (\$206). Tax extra.

All divers must purchase the e-learning module, but the course fee (\$250) is FREE with the purchase of a Dry Suit from Float N' Flag. Rental suits are available for the Tobermory Course weekend but otherwise, you need your own drysuit for the course.

Schedule: Specific Dates/Times to be determined with diver(s) taking the course (Tobermory Weekend Course detail are available at the store. Below is sample timing for our regular course)

Session #1: Class @ 6:00pm-8:00pm - Classroom at Float N' Flag Session #2: Pool or Confined Open Water dive site @ 9:00 am Session #3: Open Water dives @ 6:00pm - Gulliver's Lake

Toby Weekend Overview: Class will be at FNF in advance of weekend. Orientation dive and 2 Open Water dives will be done in Tobermory. Lodging and Sunday charter are booked. Estimated weekend cost is \$550 (accommodations, food, charter & Instruction) + Drysuit rental (approx \$175) plus purchase of seals (approx \$80).
